- 32 Residency (LC State) credits required for graduation.
- All Elementary Education candidates must pass the Praxis 5001 or 7811 series prior to Internship I. Praxis exams required for the minor endorsement area must be passed prior to Internship II.
- 36 credits must be upper division (300/400 level).
- Students who transfer without being "core complete" may need to take additional LC State General Education core courses.

A minimum grade of "C-" or better and a minimum 2.0 GPA is required for all general education courses.
