- Troubles accessing WarriorHub

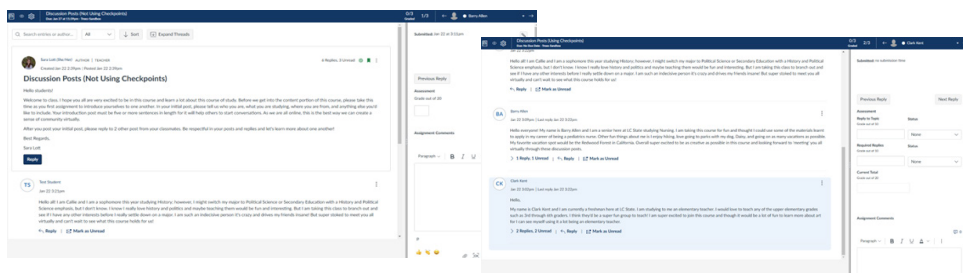

Discussion Posts in SpeedGrader

Many faculty noticed a pretty significant change to Speedgrader recently, in relation to Discussion posts. Those changes were a result of a planned, Canvas wide change that we, in eLearning, have no control over. Coincidentally, this change took place at the same time Checkpoints for Discussions came online. This allows instructors to have differing due dates for initial responses and replies, which we did opt to turn on at the request of several faculty who have been patiently waiting for it to be released. Please be assured Checkpoints was not the reason Speedgrader went crazy, nor would turning it off revert it to how it once was.
