Announcements

- Admin Building Closed Nov. 25-27: The Administration Building will be offline Nov. 25-27 as an
 electrical panel is upgraded. During this time, the electricity to the building will be shut off.
 Supervisors of employees who reside within the Admin Building have been notified and will provide
 information regarding relocation or remote work options. Those who need to interact with Admin
 Building offices during this time are advised to coordinate work needs in advance or remotely.
 - The **cashier's window** in the Administration Building will be closed due to the building shutdown the week of Nov. 25-29. The Controller's office requests that departments hold their deposits in a secure location during that week and deliver them by 11:30 a.m. on Monday, Dec. 2. This will allow staff to still get them posted into November before closing the month.
 - Accounts Payable will be unable to process checks during the week of Nov. 25-29 due to the Administration Building shutdown. Normal processing of AP and Travel will resume on Monday, Dec. 2.
- Certificate of Insurance (COI): If a third party requests proof of LC State's insurance coverage, please refer to this <u>website</u> for the updated process. - **Fidelity:** Just a friendly reminder that your Idaho Optional Retirement Plan is moving to Fidelity. Beginning on Nov. 22, at 1 p.m., you will no longer have access to your Idaho Optional Retirement Plan mutual fund account at Corebridge or TIAA. Your mutual fund balance will transfer on Dec. 3, from Corebridge and on Dec. 4, from TIAA. You will be able to access your Idaho Optional Retirement Plan account at Fidelity during the week of Dec. 22. To stay updated, please visit the transition website at www.myfidelitysite.com/ISBOE.
- FLSA Update: On Nov. 15, a federal judge in Texas ruled to block the Biden administration's proposed revisions to overtime rules under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). If enacted as proposed, the FLSA changes were set to take effect on Jan. 1, 2025, and would have impacted the minimum salary threshold for exempt employees, with automatic adjustments every three years. As a result of the November ruling, FLSA salary adjustment considerations have been suspended.
