THE PRESIDENT'S MEDALLION

The President's Medallion is awarded to individuals who have significantly impacted Lewis-Clark State College by demonstrating high personal standards, commitment to lifelong learning, and personal growth. Their efforts have contributed to the quality of instruction, life on campus, and in the community. They have offered leadership, personal energy, or resources to enhance the educational experience and environment at the institution and the community. Their contributions, in various forms, benefit the institution and those who work and learn here.

The 2024 recipient of the President's Medallion is Dr. William Mannschreck.

How Dr. Mannschreck and his wife, Ronnie, came to Lewiston in 1954 was truly a thing of chance – but looking back now, it seems more like fate. If the coin landed tails, they would go east, if it landed heads, they would go west. Luckily, for Lewis-Clark State College and the LC Valley, the coin landed in our favor and the rest is a history to be celebrated – a story of innumerable contributions to the college and community for over 70 years.

The Mannschrecks were looking at jobs and places to live throughout the U.S. Dr. Mannschrek had just graduated from his medical residency, and they were undecided where to start his medical practice. So, they flipped that fateful coin and it came up: West. They focused on 15 different towns, and Lewiston, Dr. Mannschreck says, seemed to really, really want him. When they first arrived, he was newly trained from a children's hospital in Denver that was the polio center for the region. Dr. Mannschreck quickly learned the polio virus was rampant in Lewiston, and he was the only physician with specific training in that disease, so all the polio patients became his. St. Joseph Hospital, now St. Joseph Regional Medical Center, had three iron lungs to keep polio victims alive while they fought the disease. Most of the 50 or so polio victims under Dr. Mannschreck's care survived.

At the age of 62, and after a full career focusing on pediatrics, Dr. Mannschreck decided to build on his expertise and service potential by pursuing a four-month fellowship program at the University of Washington, focusing on the fields of allergy and immunology. He took the board examination to be certified and then practiced in these areas for another 10 years. Dr. Mannschreck retired at the age of 72.

In addition to, and alongside a prestigious and productive professional career, Dr. Mannschreck engaged a full life of service to various organizations in the LC Valley. He became a charter member of the LC State Foundation Board in 1984, and served as chair of the finance committee and twice as Foundation Board President in 1987-88 and 1994-95. Dr. Mannschreck is still a Foundation Board Member today. One of his accomplishments while serving on the board was helping to raise over \$1.5 million for what is now the P1FCU Activity Center.

Upon his retirement in 1995, he played tennis almost every morning at the LC State Tennis Center,

and as a lifelong learner, regularly took classes at the college, ranging from astronomy, geology, international political economics, macro-economics, drawing, history and botany.

In addition to his service at LC State, he served for 12 years on the Lewiston School Board. Dr. Mannschreck also held positions on the board of directors for the North Central Health District for more than three decades, and was an unwavering supporter of the Lewiston City Library. He joined the Boys & Girls Club board and became president in 1962.

An outdoor enthusiast, Dr. Mannschreck completed the very first "I Made the Grade" 18-mile bicycle race up the old Lewiston Spiral Highway in 1979, a 2,000 foot climb, and was the only one to not miss a race for the next 25 years. At the 25th annual event in 2005, he was joined by eight Mannschreck children and grandchildren. His cycling passion also led to him to cycle across the United States.

Dr. Mannschreck and Ronnie were married in 1951, one week after he graduated from medical school from the University of Nebraska. Ronnie graduated from the school's nursing program and supported Dr. Mannschreck for the first year of their marriage while he finished up his medical studies. After 67 years of marriage, Ronnie passed away in 2018. Together, they had four children, Tom, Molly, John and Bob, all living in the Northwest, plus nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

All four of Dr. Mannschreck's children are here today as we recognize, honor and celebrate his positive impact on LC State and the LC Valley, and the model his life and work represent in terms of high personal standards, commitment to lifelong learning, personal growth, leadership, and service.

Congratulations, Dr. Mannschreck, we applaud you!

DEBORA LEMON

Debora Lemon, an associate professor of nursing, has served the college since 2004. Prior to this she worked in acute care, primarily medical/surgical nursing, home health, and in long-term care nursing homes as a director of nursing and nursing home administrator. She has also served as nursing consultant for Adult Family Homes for about 15 years while teaching.

Debora earned her LPN and RN at Truckee Meadows Community College in Reno, Nevada. She moved to Lewiston, Idaho, as a new graduate nurse in 1983, completing her BSN at LC State in 1987. In 2006, she earned a master's in nursing from Washington State University-Spokane.

At LC State, Debora has served as a professor and director in the LPN program. In 2008, she joined the BSN program as an associate professor, eventually serving in a lead role for BSN courses and tracks. She received the President's Award for Outstanding Teaching in 2011. She lists taking population health students to Nicaragua for a medical mission and serving as one of the first simulation champions for the nursing program as two of the highlights of her career.

"LCSC is a great place to work," Debora said. "I most enjoyed the collegiality with everyone in the division of nursing and health sciences as well as throughout the LCSC campus, working with the Petition Committee members for many years, and seeing students succeed to achieve their goal of becoming great nurses."

In retirement, Debora says she is looking forward to reading, gardening, beekeeping, and hiking the Pacific Crest Trail (in sections), as well as working with her husband, Lowell, who she thanks for being supportive of her professional endeavors. She says the most important thing she will do in retirement is to spend time with grandkids and family.

JENNI LIGHT

Dr. Jenni Light has been a professor at LC State since 2006, bringing a wealth of knowledge and experience to the classroom. With bachelor's and master's degrees in environmental engineering from Montana Tech and Idaho State University, respectively, and a Ph.D. in interdisciplinary engineering – environmental engineering and engineering education from Washington State University, Jenni's academic journey reflects her deep commitment to interdisciplinary scholarship.

Before embarking on her academic career, Jenni spent a decade in industry and government environmental engineering roles in Pocatello, Idaho. This real-world experience informs her teaching and research, enriching the educational experience for her students.

During her tenure, Jenni has been a catalyst for innovation, playing a pivotal role in developing engineering and GIS programming, and more recently, launching a drone program. Her efforts extend to creating meaningful employment opportunities tailored to students' disciplines. From conducting

traffic counts for local engineering and transportation agencies to conducting ADA inventories throughout the region, Jenni has been instrumental in developing valuable paid career experiences since 2015.

Beyond the classroom, Jenni has made significant contributions to the local community through service-learning projects since 2007. During the past 14 years she and her students have designed and built wheelchair ramps for individual households, enabling them to maintain their independence.

As Jenni transitions into retirement, she looks forward to new adventures and lots of river trips. Whether tackling long-awaited house projects, or exploring the beauty of state and national parks, she says she is definitely excited for this next chapter.

CLAY ROBINSON

A self-described "Big Sky guy," Dr. Clay Robinson earned his bachelor's in health and physical education at Weber State University, a master's in sports administration from Idaho State University, and a Ph.D. in exercise science and wellness from the University of Idaho. Early in his career, Clay coached collegiate rodeo for 10 years at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, California, leading the program to a national championship.

Clay, a professor in the Physical, Life, Movement & Sport Sciences Division, and his wife Mary Lou, a professor emeritus in the Nursing & Health Sciences Division, started at LC State in 1994. Over his 30 years at the college, he's held a number of titles but says the most important one has been mentor to students and especially student athletes. Clay has served as the Faculty Athletic Representative for over 20 years and has received numerous awards including the H.L. Talkington Faculty Achievement Award (2008) and the President's Award for Outstanding Teaching (2014). He has been named NAIA National Faculty Athletics Representative of the Year (2018), Adjunct Faculty of the Year, and Idaho Health and Physical Education College Teacher of the Year.

"What I enjoy most about LCSC is being able to go to work every day with great students, faculty, staff, and a loving and supportive wife who is just across campus working in the Nursing & Health Sciences Division," Clay said.

Clay says he plans to "ride my horses off into the sunset with my wife Mary Lou, children, and grandchildren and enjoy the mountains, lakes, streams, deserts and beauty and peace of the great outdoors." He is grateful for and proud of his three children, Cole, Jessie and Jeremiah, who have all graduated from college, including two from LC State.

Dr. Lee Ann Wiggin earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology at Lewis-Clark State College and her master's and doctorate in physical education from the University of Idaho. She started her career at LC State in 2000 on a part-time basis, going full-time in 2013, and has served as an adjunct instructor, a professor, and as an activity program director. Currently she serves as a movement and sport science associate professor in the Physical, Life, Movement & Sport Sciences Division.

Lee Ann has been a recipient of the Student Research Award and has served as president and coordinator of the Peavy Papers student awards for the Western Society of Kinesiology and Wellness. At LC State, she was the co-creator of the Community/Student Health Screening and Wellness Fair.

College-Sanctioned Honor Societies and Organizations

LC State recognizes graduates who have achieved membership with sanctioned honor societies and organizations by allowing ornamentation to be worn at commencement. Kappa Delta Pi Honor Society members have green and purple cords for teacher candidates who have earned 3.5 or higher; Social work graduates may earn membership with Phi Alpha Honor Society for a 3.25 or higher and have a silver medallion; Psi Chi Honor Society distinguishes declared psychology majors with a 3.3 or who are in the top 35 percent of their class or have a 3.0 for psychology courses with a silver medallion; and Ambassador Honor Society recognizes a 3.0 or higher and service contributions with a gold tassel.

LC State Ambassador Honor Society Members

The LCSC Ambassador Honor Society is an honorary student organization designed to provide recognition for academic excellence and achievements, and to provide opportunities to render meaningful service to the college and the community.

Ambassador graduates are awarded and usually can be identified by the gold tassels they wear on their mortarboards at commencement ceremonies.

The appearance of a name in the program is presumptive evidence of graduation and honors; it must not, in any sense, be regarded as conclusive. The academic transcript, signed and sealed by the college Registrar, remains the official testimony of the possession of the degree/certificate.

The seal symbolizes the mission and noble ideals of LC State. The college was founded in 1893 as Lewiston State Normal School, with the date depicted at the bottom of the seal.

The scalloped border encompassing the seal reflects the college's location at the confluence of the Snake and Clearwater Rivers – the path taken by Meriwether Lewis and William Clark. Within the scalloped border is a circle that represents fidelity and faith, and reflects LC State's continual and unbreakable commitment to the community it serves.

The oak leaves and acorns emblazoned on the seal's outer ring are symbols of authority and service dating back to Roman times. Their inclusion underscores LC State's enduring service to both the state of Idaho and the nation. The shield (escutcheon) at the center symbolizes the strength and the historic tradition of the college as a crossroads for America. The shield itself is divided into two fields symbolizing unity of the college's educational and service missions.

The dark (sable) color represents constancy, the white (argent) field symbolizes peace, and the emblems on the field shield depict LC State's proud tradition of excellence in letters, arts and sciences (the open book), and in industry and technology (the enmeshed gears). Above the shield is a lamp that symbolizes light, life and spirituality. The lamp also reflects the college's commitment to developing the whole person and its century-plus tradition of illuminating the lives of Idaho citizens.

The college's mace is the traditional symbol of legal and chartered authority of the people to whom the Board of Trustees has delegated authority. When the mace is present, the authority of the college is present. When the mace leaves, the authority leaves as well. For this reason, the mace enters the ceremony before the governing body.

LC State is very appreciative of artist Jim Christiansen, who crafted the mace of black walnut from a tree that existed on campus. Jim has designed the mace headpiece with carvings of the college seal and logo.

Standardized academic costumes were adopted for commencement ceremonies during the late 1800s to distinguish graduates according to discipline and degree. The custom grew so rapidly that a commission was formed to study and make recommendations for a uniform code for academic regalia. In 1896, a standard code was adopted that is still followed today. The costumes, colors, trimmings, and patterns are all traditional and reflect both the degree and field of learning.

The bachelor's gown is made of black material with long, pointed sleeves. The master's gown has oblong sleeves that open at the wrists. The doctoral gown is usually black, faced with velvet and with three velvet bars on full, round, open sleeves. The velvet trim may be black or match the hood edging, which varies by departments of learning. Some collegiate institutions have authorized doctoral gowns in school colors, rather than black.

The colorful hood is reserved for those individuals who have attained academic degrees beyond the bachelor's degree. The Intercollegiate Commission assigned and standardized colors to academic disciplines to distinguish them from their colleagues in other fields of learning and to indicate the college or university from which the wearer earned the degree. The size of the hood also indicates degree earned with the doctoral hood being the longest.

The square cap is commonly called a mortarboard and is black. Some doctors wear a soft tam or large beret. Tassels that fasten to the cap are black. Doctors, the institution's governing officials and honored guests wear gold tassels. Gold tassels also are worn by graduates who are members of the LC State Ambassadors Honor Society.

LC State bachelor candidates wear white satin stoles embroidered with the college seal. Colored cords are worn for scholastic distinction. Baccalaureate graduates earning Latin honors wear the following colored honor cords: cum laude-silver; magna cum laude-gold; summa cum laude-silver and gold. Associate degree graduates earning President's Honors wear royal blue and white cords.
