- Object Codes Matter: Correct use of Object Codes in Jaggaer and Bank of America Works is
 essential to the work and function of the Controller's Office and Information Technology. A PDT to
 inform and guide Object Code use was conducted June 4, 2024 (see: object-code-training-6-42024.pptx). We are a month in to the new code use, and improvement is needed. Please read
 on...
 - 1. Why it matters:
 - We rely on this information for accurate budgeting, inventory, and reporting for audits.
 - It helps reduce extra time spent by Controller's and IT staff hunting down information and mistakes.
 - IT needs to review IT-related purchases and keep track of equipment and software on campus.
 - In Jaggaer: When in doubt, if a supply or service could be considered IT, please select one of the IT specific codes so it routes to IT to review and provide guidance.

- Prior to making a p-card purchase that is IT related and/or could be considered a software subscription or service, email the <u>HelpDesk</u>. IT will review it and provide quidance.
- Examples of current misuse:
 - IT subscriptions or services (including online subscriptions, cloud storage, etc.) should be using the new IT-specific Objects rather than "services" (5-5150) or "supplies" (5-5720), otherwise, it will not be seen by IT in Jaggaer approval workflows, or Colleague reports.
 - When a capital outlay purchase (\$2,000 and up) is coded as supplies, the Controller's Office staff must comb through records to ensure all purchases are coded correctly.
- Object Reference Tool: Please reference the <u>new</u> object code sheet <u>found here</u> when entering any purchases in Jaggaer and when assigning objects in Bank of America Works. The Works portal has been updated with all Object Codes.

- Student Employment & Career Readiness Center Upcoming Events:
 - Sept. 10 Resume Power Hour with Schweitzer Engineering: Schweitzer
 Engineering will be on campus to review resumes. Encourage students to drop by SUB 202 between 2:30-3:30 pm for expert advice and tips as they prepare for the Career Fair.
 - Sept. 18 Career Closet Donation Day: Help support students as they prepare for interviews and the Career Fair! Last year, nearly 250 students shopped the Career Closet, which operates entirely on donations and is free for students and the items are theirs to keep. If you have new or gently used professional clothing to donate, please drop it off in SUB 202. Your contributions make a big difference!
 - Oct. 2 Pop & Prep for the Career Fair: From 4-6 p.m., students can shop the Career Closet, get their resumes reviewed, use the headshot photo station, and ask questions to ease their Career Fair jitters.
 - Oct. 10 LC State Fall Career Fair: Mark your calendars! The Fall Career Fair will be held from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. in the P1FCU Activity Center. Students are encouraged to dress professionally (visit the free career closet in SUB 202) and take advantage of this great opportunity to explore job and internship possibilities.
- TIAA Retirement Accounts: For Employees with TIAA Retirement Accounts: There have been issues with employee contributions being deposited into TIAA retirement accounts, impacting the last few payrolls. This problem has affected LC State and other higher education institutions in Idaho. The root cause involved mismatched data between LUMA and TIAA records. For example, if an employee updated their birthdate in LUMA and it didn't match TIAA's records, TIAA would reject the entire file transfer, affecting all employees. The State Controller's Office (SCO) is collaborating closely with TIAA to ensure any errors in file transfers are identified promptly, and corrective actions are taken immediately. Additional updates will be provided by TIAA and the State Controller's Office (SCO) with details on the issue, its resolution, and any retroactive adjustments to employee retirement accounts.

- **Travel:** There have been some changes to travel procedures and forms. Please visit https://www.lcsc.edu/controllers-office/employee-travel to download new forms and find new a Travel Procedures Manual. Starting July 1, the following changes took effect:
 - o Cabinet Member signatures are no longer required on the travel authorization. The form has been updated on our webpage.
 - Travel advance will only be issued for amounts of \$250 or higher.
 - Zero Dollar travel will be retained at the departmental level and do not need to be submitted to the travel desk. The department has the choice of continuing to use the Travel Authorization form or completing a memo instead. It is suggested that the whole department use the same method for continuity and the memo or TA will have to be retained per retention policy (https://www.lcsc.edu/media/5217/4103-records-retention.pdf).
 - All out of state travel that is not contiguous to the State of Idaho requires additional advance approval by a vice president. See 8.G.
