- P1FCU Activity Center Project: The P1FCU Activity Center HVAC equipment upgrades project has begun. A&R Construction will be on site Tuesday, Nov. 12, from 7 a.m.-4 p.m. with a crane to remove old equipment from the Fitness Center roof. During the time of the crane work, portions of the Activity Center and Activity Center West (ACW) will need to be vacated, including the Auxiliary Gym, Fitness Center, locker rooms directly below the Fitness Center, ACW entry hallway, and the ACW offices directly west of the entry hallway. - Email Signature (webpage): Your email signature is a direct representation of LC State and is considered an official LC State communication resource. Please review and adhere to the recently updated <u>guidelines</u>.
- Ethical Conduct (Policy 3.101): With national and state elections being held this week, please be mindful of LC State's policy regarding employee ethical conduct, which includes the following: "Employees retain all of their individual and political rights of citizenship. However, employees may not exercise those political rights in the name of LC State, or through the use of college facilities, or through the use of forms or other official stationery of any kind, or in any way that might involve LC State in partisan political activity or controversy."
- Tabling Policy (webpage): Policies and procedures have been developed that govern
 how campus spaces can be reserved and used by members of the campus and greater
 community.

- Pumpkin Carving/Decorating Contest: Thanks to all who participated in the Fifth Annual Pumpkin Carving/Decorating Contest. Congratulations to the <u>Nursing & Health Sciences</u>

The judges chose the <u>President's Office</u> pumpkin as second place, and honorable mentions went to the <u>Library</u>, <u>Human Resource Services</u>, and <u>eLearning Services</u>. For the first time in the contest's history, the winning pumpkin was also the People's Choice winner!
- Priority Registration: The first opportunity for current LC State students to register for fall, priority registration, begins Monday, Nov. 11, and continues through Thursday, Nov. 14. Registration information is available online. Please reach out to advisees, and help them review their degree completion plans and progress, and map out their next schedule of courses. Registration for new entering students will begin on Friday, Nov. 15. Transfer students are being referred to instructional divisions so they can be guided through upper division course needs and scheduling. Over the next few weeks, getting students registered and committed is a top priority.
- Purchasing Updates: Purchasing procedures have been updated to specifically detail the
 Federally Funded Small Purchase dollar limit (aka "bid limit") and requirements. The Federally
 Funded Small Purchase dollar limit is \$10,000, while our Institutionally Funded Small Purchase

- RRF/UAR Processes: As LC State kicks off the FY26 budget cycle, here is important information and guidelines for the Resource Request Form (RRF) process. This annual review enables each division/department to assess its budget within the context of this year's constraints and to identify both potential challenges and opportunities for one-time funding requests. All divisions/departments complete this process and submit their RRF to their next-level supervisor. If you're unfamiliar with the process, please reach out to your supervisor for further details.

Key Highlights:

- Budget Planning: Departments must submit plans for a 0% or flat budget, focusing on how current resources will be reprioritized to accommodate contractual or operational needs.
- One-Time Requests: There may be limited opportunities for one-time funding requests aligned with the Presidential Priorities of Value Proposition, Recruit and Retain, and Work Better Not Harder. Requests should include measurable outcomes, such as anticipated enrollment growth or self-sustainability within two years.
- Shark Tank' Presentation Opportunity: We are excited to bring back 'Shark Tank,' where you can present bold, innovative ideas for one-time funding aimed at boosting recruitment and retention. This is your chance to showcase game-changing proposals!
- Technology & Physical Plant Requests: Technology needs must align with the Presidential Priorities and be reviewed by IT, and Physical Plant (PP)-related requests must be reviewed by PP prior to submittal.
- New This Year: Two additional areas for certain divisions/departments –
 Administrative Fees and Auxiliary Services Annual Revenue Contribution have
 been integrated into the RRF process for a single annual review. Please review
 the new forms and consult with your supervisor to determine if they apply to your
 area.

o Important Deadline & Information:

- RRFs must be submitted to your supervisor by Dec. 2, 2024.
- The RRF form, full timeline and details, and last year's submittals and awards are available in the UAR/RRF (Program Assess, Plan, RRF) Teams Site under the files tab.
- Functional Area Committees (FACs) chaired by the area Vice Presidents or designee(s) will review Resource Request Forms (RRF) between January-February to discuss and prioritize items. Emergent priorities will be presented to the President's Executive Cabinet between February-March.

Unit Assessment Reports (UAR) process:

- All resource requests must be tied to program assessment (i.e., measurable program outcomes and self-sustainability), the college's Mission and Strategic Plan as well as the Presidential Priorities as listed on the RRF.
- All instructional units must complete full program assessment reviews this cycle.
 - Non-instructional Unit Assessment Reports (UAR) are to be submitted at least every three years, on a rotation determined by the unit, so please consult with your supervisor.
