
Monday Message

- Athletic Director: After a national search and interviewing three candidates on campus, Ronnie Palmer has been named LC State's new athletic director. Palmer, the former athletic director at Post University in Waterbury, Connecticut, will officially begin on Aug. 12. <u>News release</u>.
- **Democracy Day:** The third annual Student Democracy Day is Aug. 1. Professors Kylee Britzman and Leif Hoffmann are excited to invite students 12 and older to a day full of local tours, learning about democracy and society, familiarizing themselves with the political process, and seeing how everyday life and a variety of careers are affected by politics. The event will start (8 a.m.) and end (4:30 p.m.) at the Student Union Building/Center for Student Leadership (SUB/CSL). <u>News</u> release.
- **Password Requirements:** New password requirements are being introduced for @lcsc.edu accounts. These changes are part of ongoing efforts to enhance security and protect institutional data. A long passphrase containing a string of words is stronger than a shorter, more complex password. The new requirement will take effect the next time you are required to change your password.
 - Minimum length: 14 characters
 - Password expiration: Every 12 months
- Payments:
 - LC State has implemented PaymentWorks, a digital vendor management and payment security platform, to streamline vendor onboarding and facilitate the transition to ACH payments (electronic payments versus mailed checks). All new and existing vendors are required to register in PaymentWorks by July 31. PaymentWorks provides vendor

verification checks required by federal grants and assists in other procurement compliance checks.

- Starting Monday, Aug. 5, vendors that are not registered for PaymentWorks will not be available to select in Jaggaer for entering requisitions.
- If you need to enter a Requisition for a vendor that is not available, <u>submit a Supplier</u> <u>Request</u> in Jaggaer to request a vendor invite to PaymentWorks.
 - You only need to provide the vendor's name and email address; no W-9 required (the vendor will provide the W-9 information during the PaymentWorks registration process).

- **Tree Trimming:** TRE Tree Service will be on campus Aug. 1-2 to trim the trees along the 4th Street parking lots and around the Administration Building flag pole area. For those that normally park along 4th Street, Public Safety will be barricading off all entrances to the 4th Street parking lots along the east side of the lots. You will still be able to park in the west sides of those lots via the 3rd Street entrances, but TRE will need the whole width along 4th Street since several tree branches hang over the parking lots. For those who have children at the Kinder College, Residence Life has graciously offered the use of the College Place parking lot for parent parking during this time.
