- This advising guide is based on completion of an Associate's of Arts-Direct Transfer Agreement degree in Kinesiology: Secondary Education at Walla Walla Community College with additions made to meet lower division requirements.
- Courses used to fulfill specific general education core requirements cannot be double-counted to fulfill LC State program requirements.
- Semester credits are displayed in the LC Express plan. Quarter credits are converted to semester credits by multiplying the quarter credits by .67.
- 32 Residency (LC State) credits required for graduation/36 must be upper division.
- The "X" in the LC State column indicates the class was likely transferred if student chose WWCC elective.
- Completion of a degree in Secondary Education Kinesiology leads to a State of Idaho Standard Instructional teaching certificate with endorsements in Physical Education K-12 and Health 6-12.
- The LC State teacher education program is nationally accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) and state-accredited by the Idaho State Department of Education. Because the State of Idaho is a member of the NASDTEC interstate agreement, your Idaho teaching credential will be accepted by other states that are also members of NASDTEC. Conditions uniquely applicable to a specific state's certification may apply (e.g. additional testing, coursework, etc.). At WWCC a minimum grade of "C-" is required for Gen Ed courses and a minimum 2.0 GPA is required to qualify for Associate's Degree. LC State teacher education program requires a minimum cumulative 3.0 gpa and a minimum 3.0 gpa in the content area.
