Monday Message Sept. 30, 2024



Dear all,

As you read this I am en route to Boise to present to the State of Idaho Permanent Building Fund Advisory Committee (PBFAC). Annually, state agencies (e.g., LC State) present physical/facility needs associated with capital projects, deferred maintenance, alterations and repairs, and ADA upgrades to the PBFAC. The PBFAC then makes recommendations to the legislative budget process for funding supports to address needs.

LC State's requests will focus yet again, on preserving and restoring our 131-year old campus infrastructure. My presentation directs attention toward fire safety needs, plumbing and sewer line upgrades, electrical and HVAC system repairs; along with restoration/remodel of aged facilities (e.g., ceiling tiles, flooring, carpet, window replacement, etc.); building envelope repairs (just for fun here is a link to what a <u>building envelope</u> is), electronic access controls, winterization projects (recall our January 2024 frozen pipe catastrophe), campus sidewalk improvements, central heat plant replacement needs; and a look toward the future introducing the idea of a solar array for the Schweitzer Career & Technical Education Center. I suspect that most probably don't know that we actually had to scale back a bit due to the power demands associated with the programs in that building exceeding what can be supplied (think technology programs and big equipment – CNC Machining, HVAC, auto, etc.).

A few years back we commissioned a deferred maintenance study; and, thanks to support from the Idaho Legislature we have made progress. Even so, significant needs remain, and those I will be presenting to the PFAC on Tuesday total over \$28 million. While these requests are not glamorous, and it will likely take some time, as well as repeated requests to make the progress needed; they are necessary to restoring, preserving and upgrading our physical campus so that we maintain safe and effective educational facilities, serving our students and Idaho years into the future.
