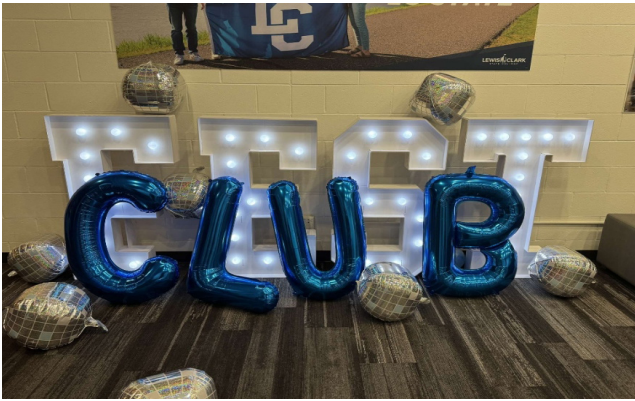

# LC Basketball Sweeps Weekend Set of Games

Both LC State basketball teams had a dominant weekend in the P1FCU Activity Center, sweeping Evergreen State College on Friday and Northwest University on Saturday.

On Friday, LC State's Women's basketball team kicked off the home weekend strong, blowing out Evergreen State 76-42. Led by guards Ellie Sander and Payton Hymas, the Warriors used a second quarter in which they outscored the Geoducks 23-6 to cruise to the big win. The two guards would combine for 26 points on the night.

The Warriors controlled the game from start to finish, creating an astounding 28 points off of 20 Evergreen State turnovers and shooting 49.2% from the field.

During the incredible performance on Friday, Junior Sitara Byrd also collected her 500th career rebound to go alongside 41 total rebounds for the Warriors.

The Women's basketball team would follow their dominant showing on Friday with another commanding victory on Saturday, beating Northwest 86-45. The team came out hot, starting the game on an 8-0 run before using a stingy defense to

push to a 44-14 halftime lead. The Warriors would lead by as much as 43 in a game that was never truly close.

Sander had another efficient performance on Saturday, shooting 8 for 11 from the field and finishing with 18 points. Byrd and Darian Herring would also add on double digit points, finishing with 16 and 14 respectively. Overall, LC State dominated in the paint, outsourcing Northwest 52-14 in the key.

The two wins improved the 19th ranked LC Women's basketball team to 16-4 overall and 10-4 in conference play.

Friday's match for the Men's basketball team was tense, but the result was a thrilling 85-83 victory over Evergreen State. The Warriors fell behind early, facing a seven point deficit within the first three minutes and a four point deficit at halftime. A strong shooting performance in the second half helped the Warriors overcome a strong 41 points from the Geoducks bench.

Sophomore Aldon Hamilton led the charge for the Warriors, finishing with nine rebounds and 19 points, including a crucial free throw in the final seconds. John Lustig produced 15 points and four assists in the contest

as well. LC State shot 60% from the field, their second highest mark on the season.

On Saturday, a strong overall second half helped propel the Warriors to another victory against Northwest, winning 81-71. The Warriors struggled from behind the arc, shooting only 2-20 from three, but were able to overcome their shooting woes with a gritty 29 points from the free-throw line.

LC State was led by 20 points from MaCarthy Morris and another 12 rebounds from Hamilton. The Warriors also forced 15 turnovers in the tight contest.

Saturday's win pushed the Men's basketball team to 15-5 overall and 10-4 in the Cascade Collegiate Conference.

Both the Women's and Men's basketball teams will next play on Friday, January 31 in the P1FCU Activity Center against Warner Pacific, with the Women's team tipping off at 5 P.M. and the Men's team at 7 P.M. For more information, visit [lcwarriors.com](http://lcwarriors.com)

# What's Happening In The World

## World News

Uganda confirms an outbreak of Ebola, with the first death, a nurse at Mulago National Specialised Hospital in Kampala, being confirmed yesterday

The Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists Announced that the Doomsday Clock has been moved up to 89 seconds before midnight. The closest to midnight the clock has ever been before.

The United States announces that the ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon will be extended to February 18.

A wind gust provisionally measured at 114 mph was recorded in Connemara in County Galway, Ireland, and a mean wind speed measured at 84 mph, would surpass Ireland's previous records

I'm Still Here becomes the first Brazilian film to be nominated for Best Picture, while Karla Sofia Gascón becomes the first openly transgender actress to be nominated for Best Actress.

Apollo-type asteroid 2024 YR4 triggers global planetary defence procedures for the first time and rises to the top of the Palermo Technical Impact Hazard Scale after recent observations confirmed it has a 1-in-77 (1.3%) chance of impacting Earth on 22 December 2032. Follow up observations in 2028 will provide a more refined estimation of the likelihood of impact in 2032

Following the meeting between Indian Foreign Secretary Vikram Mirri and Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in Beijing, China and India agree to resume direct air travel between the two countries after a five-year hiatus

At least 140 dolphins are found stranded on the shores of Mareero Beach near Bosaso, Puntland, Somalia, with 60 confirmed dead and 30 returned to the sea.

Thailand becomes the 38th country and the first in Southeast Asia to legalize same-sex marriage.

## National News

The District of Columbia Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department Says no survivors are expected after the mid-air collision between an American Airlines airliner and a military helicopter last night over Washington, D.C., United States, making it the deadliest aviation disaster in the U.S. since American Airlines Flight 587 in 2001

The United States Office of Management and Budget rescinds a memo from Monday that would have paused federal financial assistance programs implicated by select executive orders of President Donald Trump, following a temporary block of the order on Tuesday by a federal judge. Following the rescission, White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt states that the Trump administration will continue to pursue a freeze of federal funds

The United States Senate votes to confirm Scott Bessent as U.S. Treasury Secretary, making him the highest rank LGBTQ official to run the U.S. Treasury and the highest-ranking LGBTQ person in the United States

The United States Federal Drug Administration Approves Vertex Pharmaceuticals' new Journavx drug, a non-opioid analgesic used to treat acute pain and potentially eliminate the risks of opioid addiction and overdose.

President Donald Trump signs the Laken Riley Act into law, the first legislation of Trump's second term

President Trump announces plans to transform the United States detention facility in Cuba's Guantánamo Bay into a holding center for undocumented immigrants, capable of hosting 30,000 people.

Boom Technology's XB-1 trijet supersonic demonstrator becomes the first privately funded jet-powered plane to break the sound barrier at Mojave Air and Space Port

## Local News

Idaho House lawmakers on Thursday introduced a bill to block voter registration processing for people whose citizenship status isn't confirmed.

A bookkeeper from Idaho Falls is serving prison time for state income tax evasion, perjury, and grand theft after embezzling money from her church.

As of January 11th, Kootenai County Fire & Rescue Engine 15 has been boots on the ground in Los Angeles County. According the Kootenai County Fire & Rescue Facebook page, they have been assigned to Idaho Task Force 5. They are joined by Northern Lakes Fire, McCall Fire, Nampa Fire and Rock Creek Fire. Task Force 5 is assigned to the Palisades Fire.

University of Idaho commissioned a statue of its mascot Joe Vandal. On campus next week, Feb. 3-7, the artist chosen will be sculpting live, as well as providing a lecture and hosting an open house. Students, U of I employees, alumni and community members are invited to attend.

Washington State Department of Transportation warns drivers that starting tomorrow, January 31, and for the next few months, the westbound I-90 off-ramp to SR 18/Snoqualmie Parkway (Exit 25) will be squeezed down to just one lane while crews install a culvert for future improvements.

This time of year, shed hunters get excited about hitting the hills looking for antlers dropped by Idaho's big game animals. However, it is important to remember that those who are not legal Idaho residents are now required to purchase a nonresident Idaho license for hunting big game in order to legally pick-up antlers in Idaho. This new rule went into effect on July 1, 2024.

The potential legalization of magic mushrooms is heading to Olympia next week as state lawmakers prepare to hear testimony on two bills that could change the landscape of mental health treatment.

In tennis, Madison Keys wins her first major title after defeating the two-time defending champion Aryna Sabalenka, 6-3, 2-6, 7-5, to win the women's singles title at the Australian Open

Kateřina Siniaková and Taylor Townsend defeats Hsieh Suwei and Jelena Ostapenko 6-2, 6-7 (4-7), 6-3, to win the women's doubles final title

In tennis, Jannik Sinner defeats Alexander Zverev 6-3, 7-6 (7-4), 6-3, in the men's singles final to win his second Australian Open title and his third Grand Slam overall

In association football, Chelsea F.C. Women Sign American defender Naomi Girma from San Diego Wave for a world-record fee of US\$1.1 million (£881,540), making her the most expensive woman player and the first million-dollar transfer in women's soccer.

Ohio State Buckeyes win their 9th college football championship, defeating the Notre Dame Fighting Irish.

Henry Patten and Harri Heliövaara defeat Simone Bolelli and Andrea Vavassori 6-7 (16-18), 7-6 (7-5), 6-3, in the men's doubles final to win their first Australian Open title and their second joint Grand Slam title

The Philadelphia Eagles and Kansas City Chiefs win their respective conference championship games to reach Super Bowl LIX, a rematch of two years prior.

In motor racing, the Porsche Penske Motorsport team wins the 63rd 24 Hours of Daytona endurance race with drivers Felipe Nasr, Nick Tandy, and Laurens Vanthoor

In tennis, John Peers and Olivia Gadecki, both from Australia, defeats Kimberly Birrell and John-Patrick Smith 3-6, 6-4, 10-6, in the mixed doubles final to win their first Australian Open title

Mongolian sumōtori Hōshōryū Tomokatsu becomes the 74th yokozuna

# “Bookshops & Bonedust”: A Cozy Fantasy

Hello Warriors and welcome to another semester at LC State. This issue’s book review is “Bookshops & Bonedust” by Travis Baldree. It is a prequel to his “Legends & Lattes.”

Before becoming an author, Baldree was actually an audiobook narrator and he fell in love with the art, so he decided to write his own stories to tell. Baldree is currently the CEO and co-owner of Double Damage Games, and in the words of his website, as he is a veteran game developer, if you play videogames regularly you have likely played something he par-took in making.

Born in 1977 and growing up in Eden, Texas, Baldree now lives in the Pacific Northwest. His first novel, “Legends & Lattes” published in 2022, won the 2023 Astounding Award for Best New Writer. The audiobook version (which he narrated himself) was nominated for an Audie Award for Fantasy. “Bookshops & Bonedust” was published in 2023.

“Bookshops & Bonedust” follows a mercenary orc named Viv who got stabbed in the thigh and now has to spend time healing up in a sleepy little seaside town named Murk. The only issue? Viv hasn’t

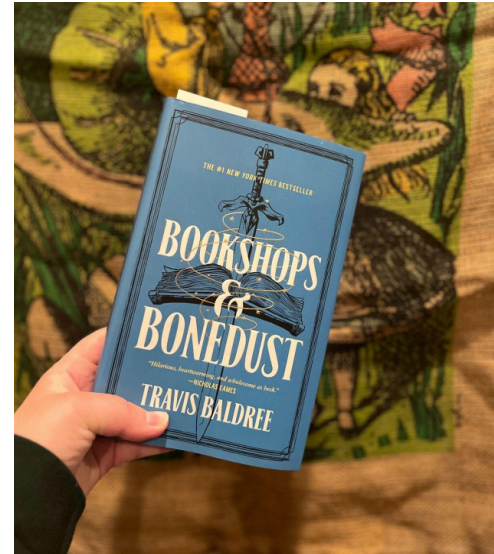

The story follows Viv as she slowly starts to love reading. # Donald Trump Inauguration

Donald Trump was officially sworn in as the 47th president of the United States this past Monday, January 20. The Inauguration ceremony, often held outside of the Capitol Building, took place inside due to historically chilling temperatures.

Aside from the expected guests, such as family members and soon-to-be cabinet members, the ceremonial podium boasted a backdrop of well-known figures – some more controversial than others. Among other donors, Miriam Adelson with a reported over 100 million donated to the Trump campaign, was seated just behind Bill and Hillary Clinton. Seated behind Trump himself were Mark Zuckerberg, Jeff Bezos and Elon Musk – three of the world’s richest men.

Quite a few speakers took to the podium on Monday. Senator Amy Klobuchar gave the opening speech in which she explained the duties of the president. More memorably, Reverend Sewell Lorenzo gave a fiery speech invoking multiple quotes from Martin Luther King Jr.

President Trump’s inauguration speech focused on implementations of his classic “Make America Great Again” motto, calling this moment

“the start of the Golden Age.” The America-first theme of his speech brought with it topics such as inflation, job creation, and domestic manufacturing.

Trump also took the opportunity to make a few slights at outgoing President Biden. He chastised the previous government for “failing to protect its own citizens” yet giving “unlimited spending” to foreign governments. Later in the day following his inauguration, Trump signed a staggering 200 Executive Orders (EO). Many of these EOs repealed those emplaced by Biden; however, many of them fulfilled promises that Trump laid out on the campaign trail. These include the designation of drug cartels as foreign terrorist organizations; declaring a national emergency at the U.S. – Mexico border; and changing the name of the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America.

Some of his EOs have drawn criticism and some praise, while others have drawn scrutiny as to their legal veracity. One such order denied automatic citizenship of any child born inside the U.S. to a non-citizen. Experts claim such an order goes against the 14th amendment of the Constitution. The Associated Press reported

that a federal judge recently blocked this EO, citing it as “blatantly unconstitutional.” Marco Rubio, who was once an opponent of Donald Trump in the 2016 republican primaries, was the first incoming cabinet member to be confirmed with a vote of 99-0 as the Secretary of State. Other cabinet nominees waiting on confirmation include Robert F. Kennedy Jr. for Secretary of Health and Human Services, Tulsi Gabbard for Director of National Intelligence, and Pete Hegseth for Secretary of De-

fense.

As Secretary of Defense, Hegseth would oversee the budget, operations and overall management of the U.S. military. Opponents of the nomination point to his lack of leadership experience in the Department of Defense as reason to vote no. Trump has described his pick as a well-needed new face to shake up the organization.

While trump has already put his pen to quite some work implementing his vision for the country, there is still much to see in the near

Some of you are here straight out of high school or even doubled down and got an Associates through dual enrollment while others went into the armed services, took a break to get married or some other life event and are schooling while working and parenting and 'adulting' in general. This is my fourth attempt at finishing a bachelor's degree and I am constantly having to reassess my routine to make sure I am stacking habits that make sense for the man I want to be looking at in the mirror.

Be sure you're being honest with yourself about what matters to you. My first turn attending college was all about trying to fulfill what I thought someone else thought was good for me and that was a bad idea. Turns out, what I thought they thought was not what they thought at all. Know thyself.

# Wolf Man Movie Review

**Wolf Man (2025)** takes a fresh and intensely emotional approach to the werewolf mythos, blending family drama, horror, and the eerie unknown into a taut, gut-wrenching thriller. Directed by Leigh Whannell, the film explores the devastating consequences of a mysterious infection that transforms humans into violent, uncontrollable creatures. With its complex relationships, tense atmosphere, and a supernatural twist, *Wolf Man* proves to be more than just another monster flick—it's a meditation on family, loss, and the fear of losing control.

The film begins with a gripping flashback to 1995, where young Blake Lovell and his father, Grady, have a chilling encounter with a mysterious humanoid creature while on a hunting trip in the Oregon wilderness. This event sets the stage for Blake's later life, marked by strained relationships and an overwhelming sense of foreboding. Fast forward thirty years, and Blake, now living in San Francisco with his wife Charlotte and daughter Ginger, is grappling with his own temper issues—echoing the conflict with his estranged father. The tension in Blake's life only intensifies when he receives a death certificate for Grady, sparking his decision

to visit his childhood home in the hopes of reconciling with Charlotte and finding peace.

The real terror however, begins once Blake and his family arrive at the house, as they're thrust into a horrifying battle for survival against a mysterious creature, which Blake soon learns is tied to his father's dark fate. As Blake is infected by the same monstrous condition, the film shifts from creature feature to a heartbreaking portrayal of a man slowly losing his humanity to an uncontrollable transformation. What starts as a physical deterioration soon morphs into an emotional unraveling, as Blake's

inability to control his growing rage and violence mirrors the torment he witnessed in his father all those years ago.

The pacing of *Wolf Man* is relentless, with each new twist adding to the mounting tension. The film is not shy about exploring the brutality of Blake's transformation—his grotesque physical changes, his loss of control, and his eventual violence toward his own family are shown in graphic detail. These moments are as emotionally harrowing as they are horrific, making the audience feel the horror not just through the monster, but through Blake's inner struggle as he battles to hold

on to his humanity.

Visually, the film is stunning. The Oregon wilderness, with its isolated forests and looming mountain ranges, creates the perfect backdrop for the creeping dread that envelops the family. The use of night vision during Blake's final pursuit of his family is especially effective, adding a primal, animalistic quality to the horror. The creature design, while subtle at first, is revealed in full terrifying detail as the film progresses, its final reveal being both grotesque and tragic, linking it back to the idea that Blake is fighting the very same infection that claimed his father. The film's climax is a masterclass in tension, as Blake, fully transformed into the creature, faces off against his family in a heart-wrenching and brutal final confrontation.

*Wolf Man* isn't just a story about a creature terrorizing a family—it's about the terror that comes from within. It's a meditation on inherited trauma, the uncontrollable forces within us, and the heartbreaking consequences of those forces being let loose. It's brutal, emotional, and at times utterly heartbreaking, making it one of the more thoughtful and memorable takes on the werewolf genre in recent years.
