Dear all,

As you know, enrollment is a driver of our success that we can directly influence. As our fall 2024 census data showed, our collective efforts, from (1) expanded outreach by our Admissions staff (e.g., electronic and snail mail, calls, texts, chats, social media live events, high school and community college visitations - with prospective students, teachers and counselors, presentations, and visitations); to (2) campus community staff, faculty, and student engagement (calls, texts, messages, visitations and presentations, etc.); to (3) thousands of hours, and dollars, we have put into our unprecedented, comprehensive and strategically targeted advertising and social media campaigns; we have all been Doing More and it is paying off. Enrollment, both headcount and FTE (highest since 2016!) are up, and especially important, up by double-digits among first-time students!

So far this fall we have hosted nearly 500 students in individual and group campus visitations. On Oct. 10, we hosted a "Career Expo" that saw 71 regional high school students attending our annual Career Fair and participating in career planning sessions. We've hosted nearly 140 prospective students on two Discovery Day programs (Nov. 8 and 16) and an additional 150 students for our rebooted Health Professions Preview Day on Nov. 15. Admissions recruiters, faculty, deans, division chairs, and faculty have visited high schools, community colleges, and college fairs throughout Idaho and in targeted locations in Alaska, Hawaii, and the Pacific Northwest. We have also conducted over a dozen tours for interested students at the Schweitzer Career & Technical Education Center.

This has been and remains an all-campus – all-hands-in effort. Your calls, texts, emails and authentic expressions of interest and connection set LC State apart; and as a result, the positive energy expressed by the campus community, our students and prospective students when they visit is palpable.

It is a great time to be a Warrior!

- Boost Productivity with Planner: The Information Technology Department is excited to highlight the powerful organizational tool, Planner. Stay organized and on track with Planner, a simple way to assign tasks, set due dates, and monitor progress. It's perfect for managing projects, tracking deliverables, and ensuring everyone stays aligned. This transparency makes it clear who is responsible for each task, when it's due, and its status. Team members can add updates or tag others to ask questions, ensuring that communication around tasks is organized and easily accessible. Planner also includes charts and dashboards to provide an overview of task completion and workload distribution. Accessing this app is simple. Just open Teams, click on the "Apps" icon in the left sidebar, and search for Planner. You can then pin it to specific channels or the side bar for easy access. Or it can be accessed through the web at https://planner.cloud.microsoft. While you are in the Apps section you can also add other tools you utilize such as Power BI for easy access within Teams. - Certificate of Insurance (COI): If a third party requests proof of LC State's insurance coverage, please refer to this <u>website</u> for the updated process. - FLSA Update: On Nov. 15, a federal judge in Texas ruled to block the Biden administration's proposed revisions to overtime rules under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). If enacted as proposed, the FLSA changes were set to take effect on Jan. 1, 2025, and would have impacted the minimum salary threshold for exempt employees, with automatic adjustments every three years. As a result of the November ruling, FLSA salary adjustment considerations have been suspended.

- Purchasing Update: The P-Card Food Exemption procedure has been updated to streamline purchasing processes for campus and community food vendors, and to reduce manual work. P-Cards are the preferred payment method for food purchases and a P-Card Food exemption form is not required, except for purchases of food with the P-Card while traveling. Purchases of food while traveling still requires the completion and approval of the P-Card Food Exemption While Traveling form. All food purchases must follow the applicable policies and procedures. The completion and approval of a Meal/Entertainment Request (MER) form prior to purchase may be required. Approved MER forms must be retained with the P-Card transaction.
