# How To Vote

With the United States presidential election coming up on November 5, many people across the country want to get involved in politics by exercising their right to vote. However, many college students may have never voted in a local, state or national election. If students haven't done so, they must first register to vote. For anyone living in Idaho, online registration is a simple process that can be completed at [voteidaho.gov](http://voteidaho.gov).

For those wanting to reg-

ister in-person, each county has a different location. In-person registration can be done at each county's Election Department. For students in Lewiston, this will be on the second floor of the Courthouse, 1230 Main Street, Lewiston, ID 83501.

According to Vote Idaho, College students can either use their home location or college address, though this might change what's on the ballot.

Out of state students can vote in Idaho using their college address as long as

they have lived in Idaho for at least **30** days. Residents need to register in person or online, at least twenty-five days prior to the election. If students miss this deadline, they can still vote, but will be required to register in person at the election site on the day of the election with proof of residency and identification.

## World News

Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee President Shahriar Kabir is arrested in Dhaka on charges of crimes against humanity, mass killing, and murder for his involvement with Sheikh Hasina's government during the Bangladesh quota reform movement.

Glasgow is formally selected as the host city of the Commonwealth Games in 2026

Germany initiates rigorous temporary border checks at all of its borders in order to reduce irregular migration, prompting criticism from some European Union member nations stating that the border checks contradict the European Union's foundations of free movement and solidarity.

The United Nations General Assembly votes 124-43 with 14 abstentions to demand Israel to end its "unlawful" presence within the occupied Palestinian territories within the next 12 months

Georgia's parliament approved a law on "family values and the protection of minors" that would restrict LGBTQ+ rights.

Dominique Pélicot, the 71-year-old Frenchman accused of drugging his wife to sleep and recruiting dozens of men to abuse her for over 10 years, has admitted to all the charges against him in his first testimony since the trial opened on 2 September

North Korea announces that it will revise its constitution on October 7, with changes including the designation of South Korea as a separate country and the primary enemy of North Korea. This comes after North Korea announced that it would no longer pursue peaceful Korean reunification

Instagram introduces teen accounts for users under the age of 18 that will be private by default, limit "sensitive content," and allow parents to view who their teen(s) is messaging

## National News

Ryan Wesley Routh is charged with two gun-related crimes in federal court after being suspected of attempting to assassinate former United States President Donald Trump

The United States announces it will support the addition of two new permanent seats on the United Nations Security Council for African nations and one non-permanent seat for a small island developing nation

The Boeing Crew Flight Test capsule returns to Earth uncrewed, landing at the White Sands Space Harbor in New Mexico, United States, after being docked for three months at the International Space Station

A presidential debate hosted by ABC News between U.S. vice president and Democratic nominee Kamala Harris and former president and Republican nominee Donald Trump takes place at the National Constitution Center in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Ukrainian officials publicly distance themselves from the Donald Trump-involved shooting suspect and warn that Russia will use the situation for anti-Ukraine propaganda, following reports of the suspect protesting for the Azov Brigade and regularly calling for international support and troops for Ukraine.

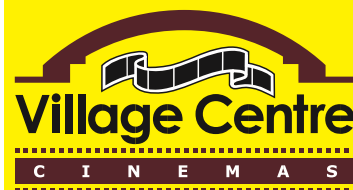

“How do you celebrate your culture?”

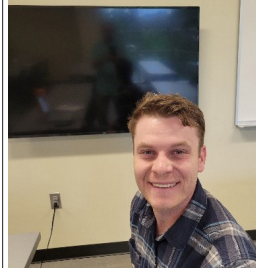
